A year and a half ago, we announced a program called "Revitalization." At the time, there was a feeling that our church life could use a lift or some change. So, we held a workshop in March of last year to identify those areas and seek solutions.

The workshop was very productive. Key themes that emerged were:

- A need for improved communications
- More opportunities for fellowship
- Growth through new members

The response to those needs so far has been:

- A Communications Director position was created and filled:
 - Weekly "Hope's Happenings" are now emailed to members
 - Hope's website has been completely rebuilt
 - Our social media presence is greatly enhanced
 - The driveway sign is regularly updated
- A Saturday morning Bible Study was established and is ongoing
- The Prayer List was revised for Sunday distribution with announcements
- A Welcome Table in the narthex was created
- A keyboardist was engaged for the "contemporary" service
- The 3rd Sunday @ 3 programs were created and are ongoing
- Monthly birthday celebrations are held
- Welcome packets have been made available for visitors
- The area behind was altar cleaned up to enhance the appearance of the sanctuary
- A Time and Talent Survey was completed

All of this was made possible with the dedication and support of Hope's family. We are blessed to have the resources, both human and financial, to make Hope what it is today.

But we are not done. Remember the story of the Buick idling at the traffic light? The passengers were comfortable, but the car wasn't going anywhere. Well, the light has turned green and we are moving, but we're still in first gear.

So, what are we to do now? Jesus had a couple of things to say that might guide our thinking:

- ¹⁹ Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, ²⁰ teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, to the end of the age." - *Matthew 28*
- ³⁷ Then the righteous will answer him, saying, 'Lord, when did we see you hungry and feed you, or thirsty and give you drink? ³⁸ And when did we see you a stranger and welcome you, or naked and clothe you? ³⁹ And when did we see you sick or in prison and visit you?' ⁴⁰ And the King will answer them, 'Truly, I say to you, as you did it to one of the least of these my brothers, you did it to me.' *Matthew 25*

Soon, we will all be receiving that annual stewardship letter asking for a financial pledge. While this may not be our favorite time in the church year, it does give us an opportunity to reflect on how Hope might grow as more of a 'Matthew 25' or 'Matthew 28' community and how each one of us can use our gifts to contribute to that growth.

Sunday school will be meet on October 13th and October 27th this month. Children are asked to attend worship with their families and will be dismissed to Sunday School following the children's chat in the service.




Check out the chalk! Sunday School students were busy coloring crosses on the sidewalk at Hope.

Fifty-one women and two pastors of the Northeast Zone of the Ohio District LWML, gathered together for their fall retreat at the beautiful Jordon Creek Park educational center in the Lake Metro Parks. **Marg Godale, Mary Osicky & Celia Esala from Hope** were blessed to attend this event and enjoy the harmony of the women singing together, a beautiful walk through the park with scripture readings and making scarves for the Salvation Army to give away.

Our theme was God's Gift of Rest (Relax-Enjoy-Seek-Trust) based on Exodus 33:14 "The Lord replied, "My Presence will go with you, and I will give you rest". Pastor Steve Hackman from Shore Haven Lutheran Church shared a presentation on "Sabbath, a Time of Rest". Pastor Steve Berndt, our zone counselor, taught a bible study entitled "God's Promises of Rest in Scripture".

The generosity of the women was evident by the money they gave for two projects. The first was an ingathering of over \$1,000.00 for **Sleep in Heavenly Peace**. This is an organi-

zation that builds and delivers beds to children who do not have a bed. Their motto: "No kid sleeps on the floor in our town!" The second offering was a special mite offering that collected over \$500 to be given in thanksgiving to help fund **LWML Mission Projects** in memory of Jack Schilmmelmann. Jack was the husband of Jeannie Schilmelmann, who is a past president of the Ohio District LWML.


