PASTOR'S MESSAGE—WHY ASHES?



Dear Sisters and Brothers in the Crucified One:

Ash Wednesday is upon us soon and many of us Christians will line up in churches around the world to have ashes smeared on our foreheads with the reminder, "Remember you are dust and to dust you shall return."

A smudge of ashes on our face is, frankly, kind of ugly, and that's all right – it's not intended to be a fashion statement – it's a sign of our mortality, of repentance and regret over our sins – a public witness, not that we're really holy, but that we're really unholy. Definitely a counter-cultural phenomenon!

The world is always busy making excuses, justifying bad behavior, or giving sociological explanations for being miscreants. Witness politicians never being able to admit to poor decisions, or criminals not willing to acknowledge guilt, or the many people who never confess wrong-doing or apologize for their actions until they're caught. I'm frequently amazed at some public figures' tortuous efforts to explain themselves.

Christians know that sin is sin, they know right from wrong, and they know when they've done wrong. They know that sin is an affront to their heavenly Father and that it deserves nothing but punishment – that's the clear teaching of the Bible. But they also know this, from the Bible: *"If we say we have no sin we deceive ourselves and the truth is not in us, but if we confess our sins, God, who is faithful and just will forgive our sins and cleanse us from all unrighteousness."* (1 John 1: 8, 9) By the way, it also says there in the next verse, *"If we say we have not sinned, we make him a liar, and his word is not in us."* (So much for making excuses.)

The applying of ashes is a practice almost as old as life itself that has commonly symbolized sorrow (many people would cover themselves in ashes when their spouses died) and contrition over sin with a sincere intention of changing one's course in life.

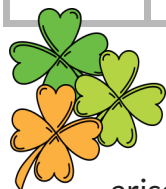

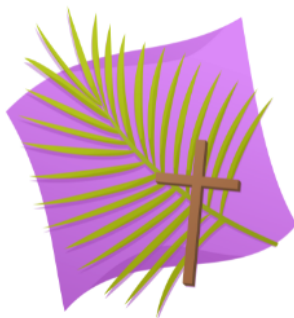

All colored pictures need to be returned to the basket by April 6th.



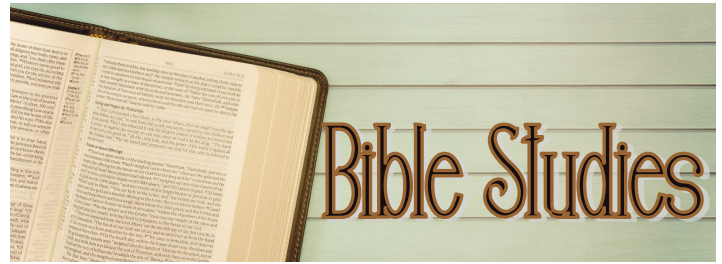

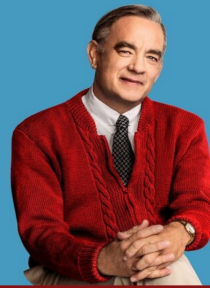

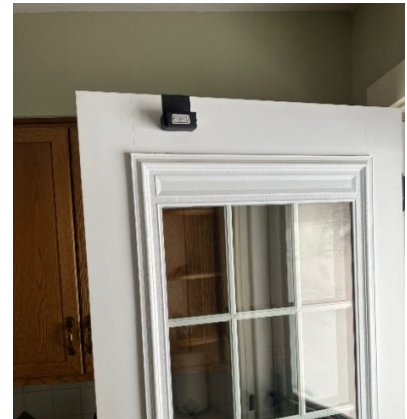
DID YOU KNOW . . . The city of Aurora offers a Residential Lock Box Program.

Are you concerned that you or a relative might suffer a medical emergency while home alone and unable to get to the door?

A residential lock box is a small secured key box attached to your door that securely stores a house key for emergency situations. The lock box is only accessible by the Aurora Fire and Police Departments and will allow emergency personnel to access a residence in an emergency without damaging a door or window. This program began on April 1, 2017.

The program is offered by the city through the Aurora Fire Department where the lock boxes can be purchased for \$35. Once a box is purchased, a representative of the Fire Department will contact the resident to schedule installation.

NARTHEX AREA AUDIO SPEAKER
